being expected in Canberra to meet with the USA President later in the day.

ASCCA is indebted to all our generous speakers throughout the two days for volunteering their time and expertise so cheerfully. We also appreciate the dedication of our information stall holders for patiently listening to our questions and offering help and instruction on their services and products - all of which were most relevant to our needs as seniors interested in technology.

As usual Microsoft were very generous to us with the three speakers they gave us and the panel of experts who were available for the whole of both days of the conference.

It was helpful to have the insights of Lyn Dalton, CEO of the Centre for Volunteering and we found we could relate to many of the problems she presented and the solutions she suggested. Heather Garnsey, EO of the Society of Australian Genealogists informed us of the amazing scope of information available online while warning us not to be careless as a result of the ease and volume of data available. We gasped with amazement at Daryn McKenny's practical demonstration of the timeline of Aboriginal history and culture. Daryn, who is the GM of Miromaa Aboriginal Language and Technology Centre engaged us in the quest to preserve all indigenous languages throughout the world.

Steve Dunscombe from Choice introduced us to the Choice Computer Magazine and told us of "the Peoples' Watchdog's" efforts to provide impartial advice to consumers. We learned about the excellent webtools available to us on the new MoneySmart Website from Nicole Hoschke who is one of their Financial Planners working to provide relevant information particularly for seniors. We also had the opportunity to discover from Simon Gee, Manager Operations and Business Innovation, Connecting Up Australia about the latest assistance available to non-profits.

All our Concurrent Sessions were well supported and we were grateful to have Leonie Erickson from Centrelink, Paul Parton from FamilySearch, Caroline Romeo from the HACC Multicultural Access Program, Rob Drummond from Quantum RLV and Adam Ireland and Deeps De Silva from Microsoft to share their expert knowledge.

However, we were also proud to be able to offer exciting sessions with so many of our own "home grown" enthusiasts who helped us explore ideas and "gadgets" like iPads, eBay, Word Graphics, Apple Macs, Blogging and Android Smart Phones in such an enjoyable non threatening way. ## Welcome to Bexley North Seniors Club in NSW



We are excited to welcome our newest ASCCA Club, Bexley North Seniors Club which has a small weekly meeting of around 12 people with just one computer at present. The immediate goal is to teach these people, aged from 70-85 years, to use a computer and contribute to their comfortable enjoyment of life in the 21<sup>st</sup>

Century. We wish them success as they learn and pass on their knowledge to others in the area. This is certainly the perfect situation for ASCCA and our member clubs to provide encouragement and practical help to a fledgling club.

The Sydney suburb of Bexley North is part of the City of Rockdale local government area, about 13 kilometres south of Sydney. Like many Sydney suburbs, it was the coming of the railway line in the 1880s which led to its development. Later on, in the early 1930s the opening of the East Hills Railway Line with the new Bexley North Station opened the area up significantly with many new homes being built.

Around 1812 a large grant of almost 5 square kilometres of land was made to Thomas Sylvester who sold his farm in 1822 to James Chandler who named it Bexley after his birthplace in London. Today almost half the residents of this area are part of Australia's rich multicultural society.
