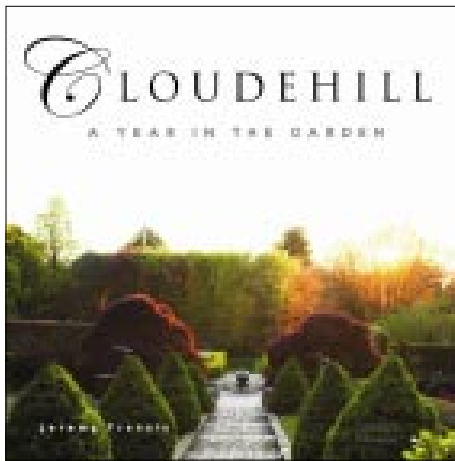


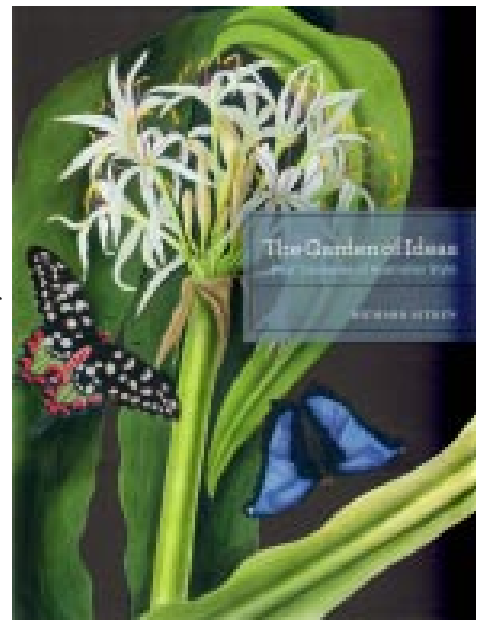

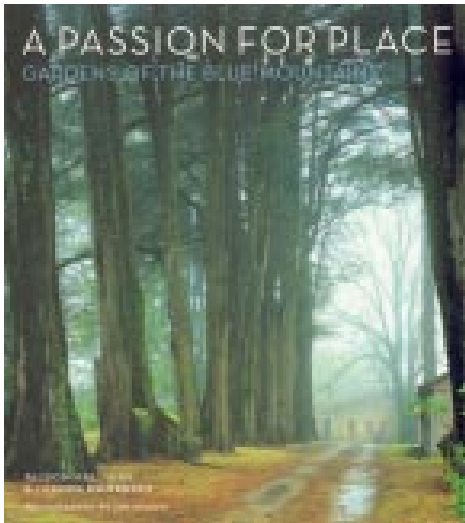

Cultured, tough, compassionate, intelligent, proud, loving, pragmatic and humorous people. Some beautiful writing, with some very special photography by Claire Takacs, this is a very satisfying book. ## JEAN GALBRAITH'S BOTANICAL LIBRARY

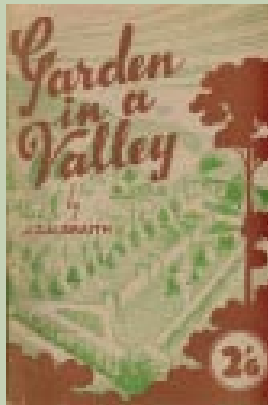


I have been fortunate to obtain the bulk of Jean Galbraith's botanical library.

Miss Galbraith (1906-1999), a renowned gardener and garden writer, was also a major 20thC Victorian field botanist, together with Dr Jim Willis and AC (Cliff) Beuglehole.

She was mentored from the age of 16 by HB Williamson, a high school principal and keen amateur botanist who was deeply involved with the Field Naturalist's Club of Victoria (FNCV).

She lived a humble life on the family property at Tyab in Gippsland, and most of her library was given to her. Many of the 40 some items came to her from Williamson, and she passed them on in due course to her younger friend, the Victorian forest ecologist Evan Chesterfield. They were certainly treated as a working library by Galbraith, with the occasional tea stain on a front cover, annotations, most often by Williamson, underlinings, evidence of silverfish, etc. Many don't have her mark on them, but I can vouch that they belonged to her. I'm listing a few titles here. If you are interested, please ask for a complete list.



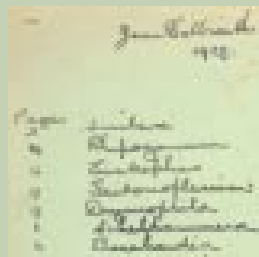
