**£10,000 REWARD**  
**FOR THE APPREHENSION OF FREDERICK WARD,**  
**AND**  
**£3,000 EACH FOR ACCOMPLICES.**  
**'THE NAME OF YOUR TEACHER HERE', VILLAIN**  
**& Others Unknown**

WHEREAS the abovenamed convict Ward, who effected his escape from the Penal Establishment, Cockatoo Island on the 11th September, 1863, is still at large, and is further charged on warrants with the commission of divers other serious crimes; and whereas, by notice dated the 25th May, 1867, a Reward of £200 was offered by Government for the capture of this offender, and a further Reward of £50 for the apprehension of any accomplices of the said Frederick Ward : Notice is hereby given that an increased Reward of £10,000 will be paid by the Government for the apprehension of the above named offender, or, if effected upon information received, then one-half of the Reward to the person giving such information, and the other money to the person or persons effecting the capture; and further, that the Government will pay a Reward of £3,000, to be similarly divided, for the apprehension of any accomplices of the said Frederick Ward, arrested in his company, or associated with him in the commission of crime. The above Rewards to be in lieu of all other Rewards payable by the Government under previous notices for the apprehension or conviction of this offender.

**TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD.**

**DESCRIPTION OF ESCAPED PRISONERS:-**

Ward is a native of Windsor, New South Wales: a labourer: 27 years of age, 5 feet 8¼ inches high, pale sallow complexion, light brown curly hair, hazel grey eyes, mole on right wrist and two warts back of middle finger of left hand.
