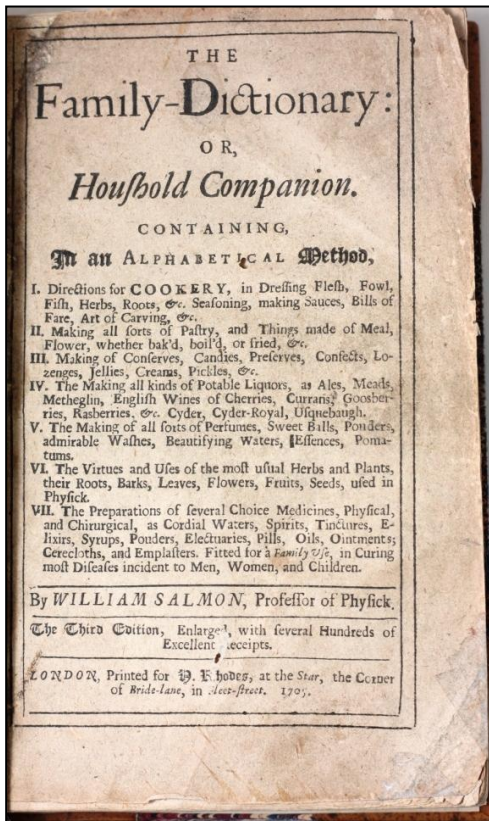

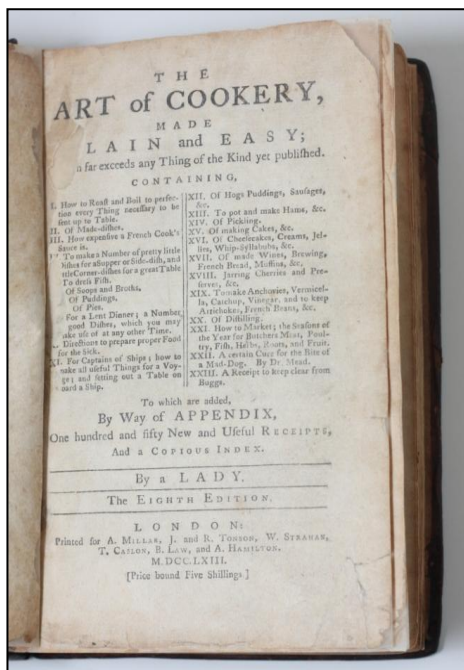
# Antiquarian Cookery Books



1. Salmon, William. **The Family Dictionary or Household Companion.** Containing in an alphabetical method, I Directions for cookery etc.... London: Printed for H. Rhodes at The Star, the corner of Bride Lane in Fleet Street, 1705. Third edition. Rebound in modern half-calf with marbled boards. Title page corners are shabby and a dozen following have dog-ears. Occasional rust stains, watermark. Remnants of insect damage affect a small section of pp 167 - 176.

*First published in 1695 by W.H, in this Third Edition William Salmon gives himself the title of Professor of Physic, although some writers suggest he was only a well-read quack. This lovely example of the household companion is a wealth of information for "Ladies, Gentlewomen and such other Persons, whose Station requires their taking care of the House." It contains instructions on the Preparation of Medicines as well as for "The Dressing of Food or Meats for conservation of the strength of the Body" and, the author claims "contains the best Receipts for Cookery that are Extant." The alphabetical arrangement of the text means that the medical remedies are interspersed with the recipes, so that for example instructions for baking a Loin of Veal are followed by remedies for Looseness of the bowel! 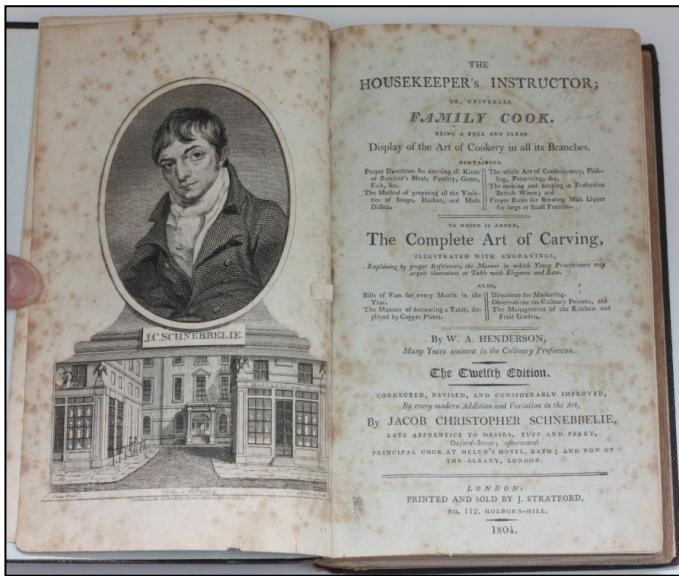

2. Glasse, Hannah. **The Art of Cookery made Plain and Easy:** Which far exceeds any Thing of the Kind yet published.... London, 1763. Eighth Edition. Original calf and eps have been laid down on new casing in a sympathetic modern (although not recent) rebinding. First four pages repaired. Pages are browned, with occasional foxing, old ink owner's name on front pastedown, small owner's stamp/sticker on rear pastedown. Otherwise this is a very nice example of this early classic.

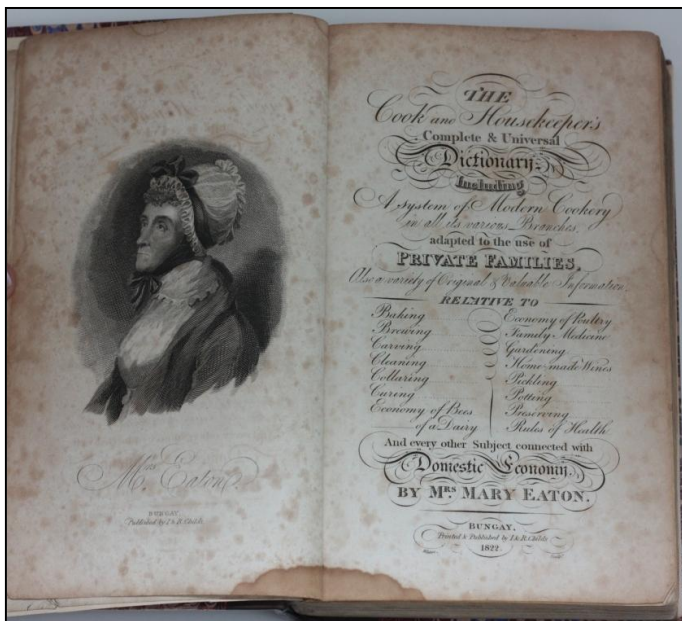
*Hannah Glasse's book, the best-known English cookery book of the 18th century, first appeared in 1747. Immensely popular, it went into many editions. A good deal is now known about Mrs. Glasse, who wrote her book from necessity, since her husband seems to have been unable to support her and their large family. (#8515)*

3. Henderson, W.A. **The Housekeeper's Instructor; Or, Universal Family Cook...**to which is added The Complete Art of Carving. Corrected, Revised and considerably improved by Jacob Christopher Schnebberlie. London: Printed and sold by J. Stratford, 1804. 12th Ed., Corrected, Revised, and Considerably Improved by Jacob Christopher Schnebberlie. Modern, though not recent, rebinding in brown leather showing wear to spine and corners. New eps. Contents fair with foxing and some stains evident throughout. The chapters on 'Collaring' and 'Pickling' show wear to the corners which has been repaired at different times. Tear to one engraving has been repaired, other engravings (including two foldout) are in good condition. Fair.

Maclean suggests 1790 as a likely date for the first edition of this popular work, although unable to find any evidence to support Simon's claim that ten editions were published before 1800. It is an attractive work, with interesting recipes and menus for the different months of the year, including a lavish one for a ball supper for twenty. J.C.Schnebberlie was chef at The Albany, of which a picture is included in the frontispiece. (#8541) **\$450**



4. Eaton, Mrs. Mary. **The Cook & Householder's Complete and Universal Dictionary** Including a System of Modern Cookery, in all its various branches, adapted to the use of PRIVATE FAMILIES. Bungay: Published by J and R Childs, 1822/3. Modern, though not recent, rebinding in 1/4 calf with attractive marbled boards and new eps. Prelims foxed and a crescent shaped stain marks bottom left-hand corner of these as well. All pages of the introduction (v - xxxii) show shadowing of the previous page. Scattered foxing throughout.

*This appears to be the first edition (according to Bitting p.139) and as Bitting remarks, shows two publication dates - 1822 on the engraved title page with a portrait of the author facing and 1823 on the following, plain, title page. Not a lot is written about Mrs. Eaton, whose dour nature comes through in her writing as well as her portrait: "A farago of French trifles and French nonsense (are omitted from this work) in order to render the work truly worthy of the patronage of the genuine English housekeeper."* (#8538) **\$450**

5. Soyer, Alexis. **The Modern Housewife or Menagere** Comprising nearly one thousand receipts for the economic and judicious preparation of every meal of the day, and those for the nursery and sick room; with minute directions for family management in all its branches. London: Simpkin, Marshall & Co., 1853. 30th thousand. Boards faded, edges bumped, plates tanned. Otherwise a tight fresh copy. Very Good. Original Cloth.

*Part of the charm of this work is Soyer's device of creating a correspondence between two ladies in which they discuss their domestic arrangements in great detail, providing the reader with many interesting insights into middle class housekeeping in the mid-Victorian period. These letters, and Soyer's own lively style, not to mention the excellent recipes, make this one of the most appealing of the 19th century cookery books. Loosely inserted is an offprint from the Times review of the work. (#5593)* **\$300**

6. Wicken, Harriet F. **The Kingswood Cookery Book**. Sydney: Angus & Robertson, 1888. First Australian Edition. Boards show sl. water-damage to front and back. Binding split at front and rear hinges. Small amount of insect damage to ffep. Occasional light stains to contents. Good. Original Cloth.

*Mrs Wicken lectured in Domestic Economy at Sydney Technical College and wrote several books, as well as contributing the recipes to Dr Muskett's "The Art of Living in Australia". The Kingswood was a popular work and in her introduction to this first Australian edition she notes that many of the recipes from the first were "quite useless in Australia. I, therefore, determined to re-write the whole of it". It's interesting to note how she sometimes gave local names to dishes, e.g. Bundanoon Pudding, Sydney Eggs, Mittagong Dumplings. Interesting, too, to learn which were new vegetables at that time - chokoes, for example, had only recently been introduced. (#8569)* **\$200**

7. Pearson, Miss (Margaret J.). **Australian Cookery Recipes for the People** As given at the Centennial Exhibition, Melbourne 1888-1889. Melbourne: The Australasian-American Trading Co. Limited, 1889. Second edition. Binding tender, and split at rear hinge. Boards have some light stains, ffep has torn from staples. Otherwise this is a nice clean copy of a pioneering Australian cookbook. Original Printed Boards.

*Scarce. Miss Pearson was a cookery instructress at the Working Men's College and other institutions in late 19th century Melbourne, having come from Scotland, where she was a superintendent and teacher of cookery. This 'Second Edition' is a follow-up to her 1888 'Cookery Recipes for the People' based upon her notes from teaching, but also (according to an extract from the Argus newspaper at rear) from the lessons she was giving in the Metropolitan Gas Company's Court at the Centennial Exhibition. "On Saturday afternoons Miss Pearson holds her class in the Education Court and her pupils are girls from ... 12 to 16". Advertisements on prelims show ornate gas stoves available from the aforesaid Metropolitan Gas Company, proving product placement and cross-promotion are not the exclusive preserve of the Masterchef era! This edition is not noted by Austin, although the 1894 3rd edition is. (#8567)* **\$450**

8. Rawson, Mrs. Lance (Mina). **The Australian Enquiry Book** Refer to me. Melbourne: W.Knapton & Co., 1898. Rebound with original cloth (which is stained and frayed) laid down and poor facsimiles of the front and rear pastedowns attached. Internally condition is good, with occasional stains. Fair. Original Cloth.

*First published in 1894, this aimed "to help people to help themselves. The young housekeeper and the old housewife [not a great marketing ploy these days], the farmer or selector...will find something of use and profit in its varied pages". Mrs. Rawson makes addictive reading, whether she is dealing briskly with a good boiled pudding, cleaning a serge suit, treating bunions, even building a house. Lovely advertising evokes its era: T. Craine, Carriage Manufacturer; Native Herbs from Alonzo.L.Bliss; Miss Elsie Just, Celebrated Cake Baker and Table Decorator (Terms Moderate, Icecream a Specialty) are just a few. (#8565)* **\$150**

9. **The Kandy Koola Cookery Book and Housewife's Companion.** Melbourne, 1898. First edition. Wraps stained, small closed tear at cloth spine. Page 63. corner has been torn and recently repaired, occasional stains within. Fair. Wraps.

*A very scarce piece of promotional ephemera, which is not mentioned in either Austin or Ferguson. "Published by the proprietors of Kandy Koola Teas for presentation to the Ladies of Victoria". Like other publications of its type it has many contemporary advertisements for brands and businesses long gone (with slogans between every paragraph!). As well as recipes (Beetroot Beer & Chilli Wine among them) it contains useful advice on household issues and quirky tips like: "What to do in cases of Drowning". (#8566)*

10. Payne, A.G. **Cole's Popular Cookery.** Melbourne: E.W. Cole Book Arcade, n.d. (189?). Cloth split at spine and some fraying to cloth at edges. Contents clean. Good. Original Cloth.

*An oddity, although bearing the title 'Cole's Popular Cookery' on the engraved cover, as well as on the title page, the book is in every other respect (including its advertisements for London establishments, and the title at the head of each page) the book Cassell's Popular Cookery. The practice of republishing an overseas publication under an Australian badge is clearly not a new one! Nice engraved illustrations and the usual collection of Victorian recipes (#8591)*

11. McGowan, Henrietta C. **The Keeyuga Cookery Book.** Melbourne: Thomas C. Lothian, 1911. Boards rubbed, some foxing, mostly to rear fep. Good. Illustrated boards.

*Miss McGowan strikes quite a modern note with her advice on bachelor meals - in this she is mindful of women living on their own (a fairly new concept) - week-end and camping cookery, and the nutritional requirements of children, to which she adds a sensible section on school lunches. The general household recipes are quite comprehensive and she pays special attention to vegetables. Interesting too that the author chose an Aboriginal word for the title, one which she states is a Western District broad-lip term meaning 'Within'. (#5725)*

12. Maclurcan, Hannah. **The 20th Century Cookery Book** A thousand practical recipes for everyday use. London: RA Everett & Co, 1901. First edition. Head and foot of spine frayed, attractive illustrated boards have some light wear. Internally, the eps are browned and there are occasional food stains. Good. Original Cloth.

*Hannah Maclurcan, one-time proprietress of hotels in Toowoomba, Townsville and Sydney, is best known for her Mrs Maclurcan's Cookery Book. This appears to be an English version of that title, with many of the same recipes. (#8573)*

13. Ulrich, Laura L. **Good Food** How to prepare it. Warburton: Signs Publishing Company, n.d. (1913?). First edition. Wraps lightly soiled, spine showing several splits and a loss of 3cm at base. eps foxed. Contents clean and fresh. Very Good. Wraps.

*One of several very early vegetarian treatises put out in the early 20th century by the Seventh Day Adventist movement. Excellent recipes. A very scarce item. (#6510)*

14. Corrie, Mrs Sophie. **The Art of Canning, Bottling and Preserving Fruits.** Sydney: William Brooks & Co., 1913. Sixth edition. Front hinge split, tape marks from old repair, pages browned, and occasional food stain. Fair. Wrappers.

*Possibly signed by the author (Inscription under frontis portrait may be printed). An article in the Adelaide Advertiser in 1911 tells the story of Sophie Corrie moving to the NSW bush with six young children to clear*

land for an orchard. She was the first woman to be appointed to a seat on the NSW Chamber of Agriculture Council and published the first edition of this book at the age of 67. It is very informative, with some useful and unusual recipes (#8627) **\$70**

15. (The Cookery Teachers' Association of NSW). **Common-Sense Hints on Plain Cookery** A companion to the Commonsense Cookery Books explaining all methods of preparing food. Sydney: Angus & Robertson, 1916. PO name and date (1916) in ink to front cover, otherwise a particularly clean and crisp copy. Very Good. Original Cloth.

*An invaluable little book at the time (and probably still useful today) containing no recipes, but instead pages of tips, hints and methods. Aimed at students and young homemakers. Scarce (#8586) **\$80***

16. **The Kookaburra Cookery Book** of Culinary and Household Recipes and Hints. Collected and arranged by the Committee of the Lady Victoria Buxton Girls' Club, Adelaide, South Australia. Melbourne: E.W.Cole, c.1917. 2nd Ed.?. Spine split at front hinge. Margins browned, otherwise a lovely fresh copy, with bright, sound boards. Very Good. Original Cloth.

*Excellent recipes, most contributed by various ladies, whose names and, in some cases, partial addresses are given. The variety, quality and sophistication of the food in this book impresses. (#5797) **\$100***

17. **(Presbyterian) Cookery Book of Good and Tried Receipts** Compiled for the Women's Missionary Association of the Presbyterian Church of New South Wales. Sydney: Angus & Robertson, 1918. 15th edition. Boards faded and stained, new cloth spine, front and rear pastedowns are poor photocopies of the original. Fair. Original Cloth.

*Immensely popular work and hard to find earlier editions in usable condition. All kinds of hints at rear, from "artistic nick-nacks" to a cure for hiccoughs. (#8575) **\$15***

18. (Fletcher, Chester & Co). **Cookery Book and Price List** containing valuable tested Continental and Australian recipes, culinary hints etc. etc. Melbourne: Privately Printed, n.d. (1920s). PO name to cover, light stains scattered throughout. Wraps soiled and lifting from staples at front and back. Fair. Staplebound Wraps.

*A nice promotional cookbook from a long-gone Melbourne grocer. Price list at rear showing 27/- for Veuve Cliquot, Vint. ; Dutch Salmon Lax (3/9) Stuhr's Caviare (4/10 ) suggest it was not your everyday grocer, although recipes are mostly quite plain. (#8732) **\$30***

19. Schauer, Amy. **The Schauer Improved Cookery Book** Over 2,500 Recipes. Brisbane: W.R.Smith & Paterson, 1923. Australian & 5th Ed. Edges of text-block, pastedowns and some pages stained. Good. Original Cloth.

*Interesting in that it was designed for a wider public than previous editions which hitherto had been "intended principally for users in Queensland". As the preface states: "the Author and Publishers have been encouraged to issue a new edition, revised, enlarged and brought completely up-to-date.....and it is hoped that...it will commend itself to housewives in all parts of the Commonwealth." Unlike other editions, this includes some recipes for preserves and a few for paper bag cookery. Other copies are available in lesser condition , please enquire for pricing. **\$110***

20. Rutledge, Mrs. Forster. **The Goulburn Cookery Book**. Sydney: Edwards, Dunlop & Co., Ltd. , 1926. 32nd edition. Covers soiled, contents browned and showing foxing to eps and some light stains. Fair. Wrappers.

*First published in 1899, and one of the most successful of the Australian cookery books. It was not revised until its 36th edition in 1937. Mrs. Rutledge intended her book for country women "who have often to teach inexperienced maids". Comprehensive and including recipes for game, brawns (three), and many for using up cold meat, as well as a great number of puddings, baked, boiled and cold. Household hints at rear include one for drunkenness with the comment "highly recommended". Interesting advertisements. (#6062). **\$20***

21. Education Department South Australia. **Manual of Domestic Art (Cookery)** Adelaide: Education Department, 1928. Occasional damp spot and wrinkling of covers, otherwise a very good copy. Good. Wraps.  
*A fascinating insight into school home economics of the early part of the 20th century. Interesting content, nice recipes* (#8730) **\$40**
22. **The Kookaburra Cookery Book** of Culinary and Household Recipes and Hints. Collected and arranged by the Committee of the Lady Victoria Buxton Girls' Club, Adelaide, South Australia. Melbourne: Printed by W.A.Comeadow, 1929. 2nd Ed. Missing eps and half-title page. Damp mark to front edge of boards has caused some colour bleed down the outside edge of text block, not affecting text. Binding is tight and sound, contents very good. Good. Original Cloth.  
*Excellent recipes, most contributed by various ladies, whose names and, in some cases, partial addresses are given. The variety, quality and sophistication of the food in this book impresses. For this edition there are additional recipes, including - sign of the times - some for cocktails, racily named "The Nineteenth Hole" or "Trocadero". Additional entrees strike a more sober Depression note with such dishes as rabbit stew, which are now of course experiencing a revival in popularity.* (#6590) **\$75**
23. **The Blossoms Cookery Book.** Adelaide: Hunkie, Ellis & King, 1931. Covers lightly soiled, otherwise, in particularly good condition, appears unused. Near Fine. Original Cloth.  
*A fundraiser for the Adelaide children's home Whitfields, this is a lovely, and rarely seen, cookery book, with excellent traditional recipes and contemporary advertising* (#8582) **\$75**
24. Withers, Frank. **The Australasian Bakers', Pastry Cooks' & Confectioners' Hand-Book** A comprehensive collection of reliable recipes, with complete directions for modern methods of manufacture under Australasian condition, with scores of useful suggestions. 840 recipes of outstanding value. Melbourne & Sydney: Barker & Co., 1937. Covers spotted, cloth on spine is bubbled. Contents are fresh and clean, binding secure. A nice copy of a particularly scarce item. Very Good. Original Cloth.  
*A very scarce item, published for professionals. Provides a vast array of large-quantity recipes, and fascinating insights into the trade, including wonderful period advertisements* (#6348) **\$90**
25. **The New Goulburn Cookery Book** by the late Mrs Forster Rutledge, newly revised by Mrs Walton McCarthy. Sydney: WE Smith Ltd, 1937. 36th Ed. Wraps stained, internally clean and secure. Good. Wraps.  
*The first edition of this popular work appeared in 1899. Substantially revised "to meet modern requirements", the book retains many of the old recipes, but includes new ones, gives temperatures and information on electric cooking.* (#7122) **\$40**
26. **Anchor Ann's Recipe Book.** Adelaide: G. Wood, Son & Co. Ltd, n.d. (1930s). Card covers creased, spine a little tatty. Recipe written in pencil on inside front cover. Good. Stapled card. (#8568) **\$30**
27. Schauer, Amy. **The Schauer Cookery Book** With which is Incorporated The Invalid Cookery Book. Brisbane : W.R.Smith & Paterson , 1939. Improved 8th Edition . A particularly fresh clean copy, looking very little used. Very Good. Original Cloth.  
*Miss Schauer's excellent book first appeared in 1909 and went into 13 editions. During the course of her long life Amy Schauer taught cookery at the Brisbane Technical College, gave classes in invalid cookery at the Mater Hospital, and, during the 1914-18 war taught basic field, camp and invalid cookery. As the A.D.B. states she "became an outstanding influence on the education of Queensland girls". Practical, public-spirited, involved in many charitable activities, she ended her days at Strathfield, Sydney, dying in 1956. Her other books are "Cookery for Invalids" (1908) and "Fruit Preserving and Confectionery" (1909). Second Copy less good, some wear to covers and occasional stain within: \$110* (#8576) **\$140**

28. (The City Tabernacle Senior Girls Missionary Union). **Book of Tested Recipes**. Brisbane, n.d. (1930s). Covers soiled, foxing and stains to interior. Fair-poor. Cloth-spine. *Scarce* (#8587) **\$20**
29. **The Willow Housewife's Handbook on Cookery**. Sydney: Wilson Bros. Pty. Ltd., N.d.(c.1939). Sixth. Very fresh and clean copy. Very Good. Illustrated card; cloth spine.  
*Interesting to see some of the Willow range of the period, which includes a butter cooler, fish fryer, roaster and the whistling kettle. Recipes interesting too. One, indicative of the period, is called Brighter Days Pudding. It is a jam roly.* (#4806) **\$25**
30. Reid, Wynwode. **New Australian Cookery Illustrated**. Melbourne: Colorgravure, N.d.(c.1940). PO inscription on ffep, small tear on illustrated ffep from where it has stuck to pastedown. Otherwise a particularly fresh clean copy with bright covers. Good. Hardcover.  
*Full of excellent recipes, particularly for cakes, jams, marmalades, jellies and fruit bottling. Enjoyable reflections of the period throughout, from illustrations of tortured garnishing to useful information on cold safes for those in remote areas without a kerosene refrigerator. Instructions, too, on how to make a haybox.* *Scarce.* (#0002727) **\$40**
31. "Miranda". **The "Miranda" Handy Book** Twelve Hundred Recipes contributed by readers of the "Weekly Times" Melbourne: Weekly Times, 1940. Pen scribble to front cover, ingredients list in ink on title page. Spine is a little fragile, but this is otherwise a particularly fresh, clean copy of a very scarce item. Very Good. Wrappers.  
*There has been a 'Miranda' offering advice and answering letters from country women in the Weekly Times newspaper since 1931 (and today has a blog). The "Women's Information Bureau" column also invited recipe contributions and the collections of these are always in demand. Early editions are very hard to come by - probably because of their relatively fragile construction - particularly in this condition.* (#8729) **\$250**
32. Schauer, Amy. **The Schauer Fruit Preserving Recipe Book and Confectionery**. Brisbane: W.R.Smith & Paterson Pty.Ltd., 1944. Covers & title pages lightly soiled, spine a bit scruffy, binding has split between title page and preface but is sound and secure. contents v.good. Good. Wrappers.  
*This modest looking little book gives sound instructions on jam making, candied fruit, drinks and cordials, pickles and chutneys, vinegars and sauces, fruit butters and cheeses. Miss Schauer, teacher of cookery at Brisbane Technical College, first published this in 1908. Rather scarce. Several copies of this in varying conditions are available, please enquire.* (#6171) **\$60**

33. **"Aerophos" Recipe Book**. Melbourne: Albright & Wilson, 1958. 11th edition. Very Good. Spiral\_bound.
